English Composition	<p><i>* 6 semester hours/9 quarter of English Composition.</i> This should be the freshman composition sequence. Remedial English and English as a Second Language (ESL) course are not acceptable to fulfill this requirement. English courses must be taken from the English Department.</p>		
Humanities/Fine Arts	<p><i>*12 semester/16 quarter hours of Humanities/Fine Arts.</i> Recommended areas include literature, philosophy, history, ethics, foreign language, art history, or music history. Studio or performance classes in art and music are not acceptable.</p>		
Social and Behavioral Sciences	<p><i>* 12 semester/16 quarter hours of Social and Behavioral Sciences</i> Recommended areas include cultural diversity, anthropology, psychology, psychobiology, economics, political science, geography, and sociology</p>		
Advanced Placement (AP) Credit	AP credit will be accepted as fulfilling the first semester of any prerequisite sequence		
College Level Examination Program (CLEP) Credit	CLEP credit will NOT be accepted to fulfill any of the prerequisite courses		
Distance and Online Courses	Distance and online courses are not accepted to fulfill prerequisite courses
