English courses must be taken from the English Department.</p> <p>Humanities/Fine Arts                      <i>* 12 semester or 16 quarter hours of Humanities/Fine Arts.</i> Recommended areas include literature, philosophy, history, ethics, foreign language, art history, or music history. Studio or performance classes in art and music are not acceptable.</p> <p>Social and Behavioral Sciences                      <i>*12 semester or 16 quarter hours of Social and Behavioral Sciences</i> Recommended areas include cultural diversity, anthropology, psychology, psychobiology, economics, political science, geography, and sociology</p>
